

## 2017 Prices and Fees

Certification fees are the major source of revenue for financing all Lifesaving Society activities and therefore reflect more than just the award administration costs. Fees are established annually and are effective for 12 months commencing January 1. Normally, Affiliate Members add this charge to the cost of lessons at registration time.
